CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR DECEMBER 2012

(Base Period : October 2010=100.0)

Consumer Price Index for December 2012 decreased by -0.4%. With an Annual Inflation Rate of 1.3%.

The Consumer Price Index covers price changes in Tongatapu Division only. The weights were derived from Household Income and Expenditure Survey of 2009

- 1. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for December 2012 recorded a decrease of -0.4% over November 2012 (105.4) and now stands at 105.0. In comparision with the previous month, Local Index decreased by -2.3% and Imported Index marked an increase of 0.9%.
- For the previous two months, October 2012 recorded an increase of 0.1% while November 2012 recorded a decrease by -0.2%.
- 3. The Annual Rate of Inflation for December 2012 was 1.3% compare to 1.5% in previous month. Local Index marked a decrease of -0.1% while Imported Index marked an increase of 2.3. The annual inflation for the same month of previous year, December 2011 was 3.8%.
- Changes in each group compared with the previous month are as follows:
 - A. FOOD -0.9%

The Food Group recorded the major decrease in the Index position of December 2012 due mainly to decrease in price of the Local Food, Fruits & Vegetable such as tomatoes, capsicum, cucumber, carrots, ripe & green banana, taro wetland & dryland, maioke and sweet potatoes from previous month. But imported, Fruit & Vegetable marked an increase causes by the increase in price of imported apple and onion. Overall price of Meats, Fish & Poultry marked an increase because of the price recorded in both Local seafood and Imported meat such as octopus, mixed string fish, sea urchin, vasuva, chicken pieces, mutton flap and salted beef. In addition, Dairy Farm & Vegetable Products also recorded a price increase causes by the increased in price of egg, cheese and margarine. While Cereal & Cereal Products and Other Food marked a decrease due mainly to decrease in price of flour, sugar and tomato sauce compare to previous month.

B. HOUSING 0.0%

Prices of items in this group recorded no change compared to previous month.

C HOUSEHOLD OPERATIONS 0.6%

Household Operation marked the largest increase toward December 2012 Index position by 0.6% due mainly to the increase in price recorded for LPGas.

D. CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR 0.0%

Prices of items in this group recorded no change this month compared to previous month.

E. TRANSPORTATION -0.8%

Transportation Group marked the second largest decrease of -0.8% toward the Index position of December 2012. This was due mainly to decrease in price of fuel both diesel and unleaded.

F. TOBACCO, ALCOHOL & KAVA TONGA 0.0%

Prices of items in this group recorded no change compared to previous month.

G. MISC. GOODS AND SERVICES 0.1%

Prices of items in this group marked a price increase due mainly to increase in price of Cosmetics & Toiletries like toothpaste.




Fig 1: Graphical representation of Consumer Price Index for Total, Local and Imported Components




Fig 2: Graphical representation of Annual Inflation rate (%) for Local, Imported and All Items as measured by Consumer Price Index (CPI)



About the Consumer Price Index

The Monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) published by the Statistics Department is accepted as the official measure of inflation in Tonga. The CPI measures the changing price of a fixed basket of goods and services purchased by Tongan households. The selection and relative importance of the goods and services in the CPI basket represents the overall expenditure pattern of Tongan households.

The CPI is used by ministries and other agencies for monitoring economic performance and by the National Reserve Bank of Tonga to help set monetary policy.

The new index reference period of October 2010 (=100.0) was first published for the month of October 2010. Data from the Household Income and Expenditure Survey (HIES) 2009 was used to determine the expenditure pattern of consumers. The proportion of expenditure on each item or group is referred to the weight. The previous reference period was November 2002 based on the results of HIES 2001.

There are 222 items in the Tonga basket classified to seven major groups. The items are further classified by whether they are imported or have been produced locally. The pricing outlets selected in Tongatapu include the Talamahu market (agriculture produce), the Vuna Wharf (fresh fish), super-markets, village stores, petrol stations, restaurants, airlines etc. The CPI covers price changes in Tongatapu Division only due to communication problems with outer island divisions.

The groups and their index reference period weights are shown in the table below.

Further definitions

A **price index** measures the change in price between time periods for a given set of goods and services. It summarises a set of prices for a variety of goods and services collected from a number of outlets.

The **index reference period** is the benchmark to which prices in other periods are compared (e.g. if the index number in a later period is 115, prices have increased by 15.0 percent since the index reference period). Prices for later periods can also be compared in similar fashion.
