CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR NOVEMBER 2013

(Base Period: October 2010=100.0)

Consumer Price Index for November 2013 Decreased by 0.9%. With an Annual Inflation Rate of 0.6%.

The Consumer Price Index covers price changes in the Tongatapu Division only. The weights were derived from the Household Income and Expenditure Survey (2009).

1. The **Consumer Price Index (CPI)** for **November 2013** decreased by **0.9%** to **105.9** from **106.9** in **October 2013**. Over the previous two months, the index for all items increased by **0.1%** in **October 2013**, and **0.1%** in **September 2013**.
2. When comparing the local and imported indices for **November 2013** to the previous month, import index recorded an increase of **0.1%** and local index decreased by **2.3%**.
3. The **annual inflation rate** for **November 2013** was **0.6%** compare to **1.4%** in previous month. The annual inflation for **November 2012** was **1.4%**.
4. When comparing the **annual inflation rate** of local and imported indices for **November 2013**, the local index recorded a deflation of **-1.9%** while the imported index was **2.3%**.
5. Changes in each group compared with the previous month are as follows:

| | Food Group recorded a decrease towards the index position of November 2013 . This was largely due to decrease in prices of most local roots crops, fruits and vegetables and local seafood items such as Taro, yams, sweet potatoes, cassava, Pele, Tomatoes, capsicum, H/cabbage, carrots, pineapples, pawpaw, string fish, octopus and cockle pips. Price of some imported food items such as tinned & packaged food, frozen meat increased. | |

| | Increasing prices of some common construction materials such as timber and paint compare to previous month. | |
| C. | HOUSEHOLD OPERATIONS | 0.0% |
| | Household Operation index marked no change compared to the previous month. | |
| D. | CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR | 0.0% |
| | Prices of items in this group recorded no change this month compared to the previous month. | |
| E. | TRANSPORTATION | -0.9% |
| | Transportation index marked a decrease in the index position of November 2013 and was due mainly to decreases in prices of fuel both Diesel and Unleaded . | |
| F. | TOBACCO, ALCOHOL & KAVA TONGA | 0.0% |
| | . Prices of items in this group recorded no change this month compared to the previous month. | |
| G. | MISC. GOODS AND SERVICES | 0.1% |
| | An increase in index of this group was due mainly to increase in price of some items from Medical Health supplies. | |



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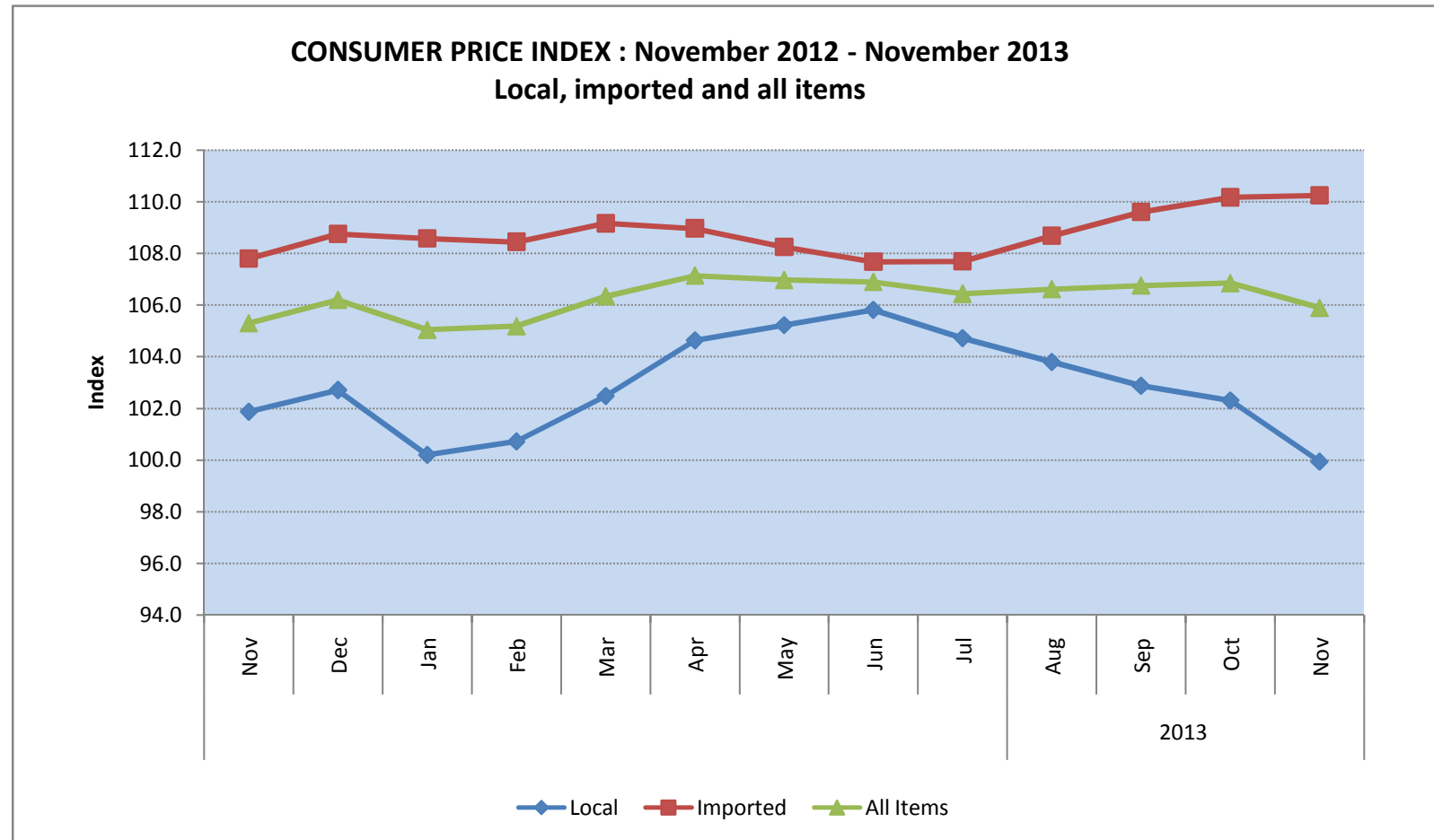


Fig 1: Graphical representation of Consumer Price Index for Total, Local and Imported Components

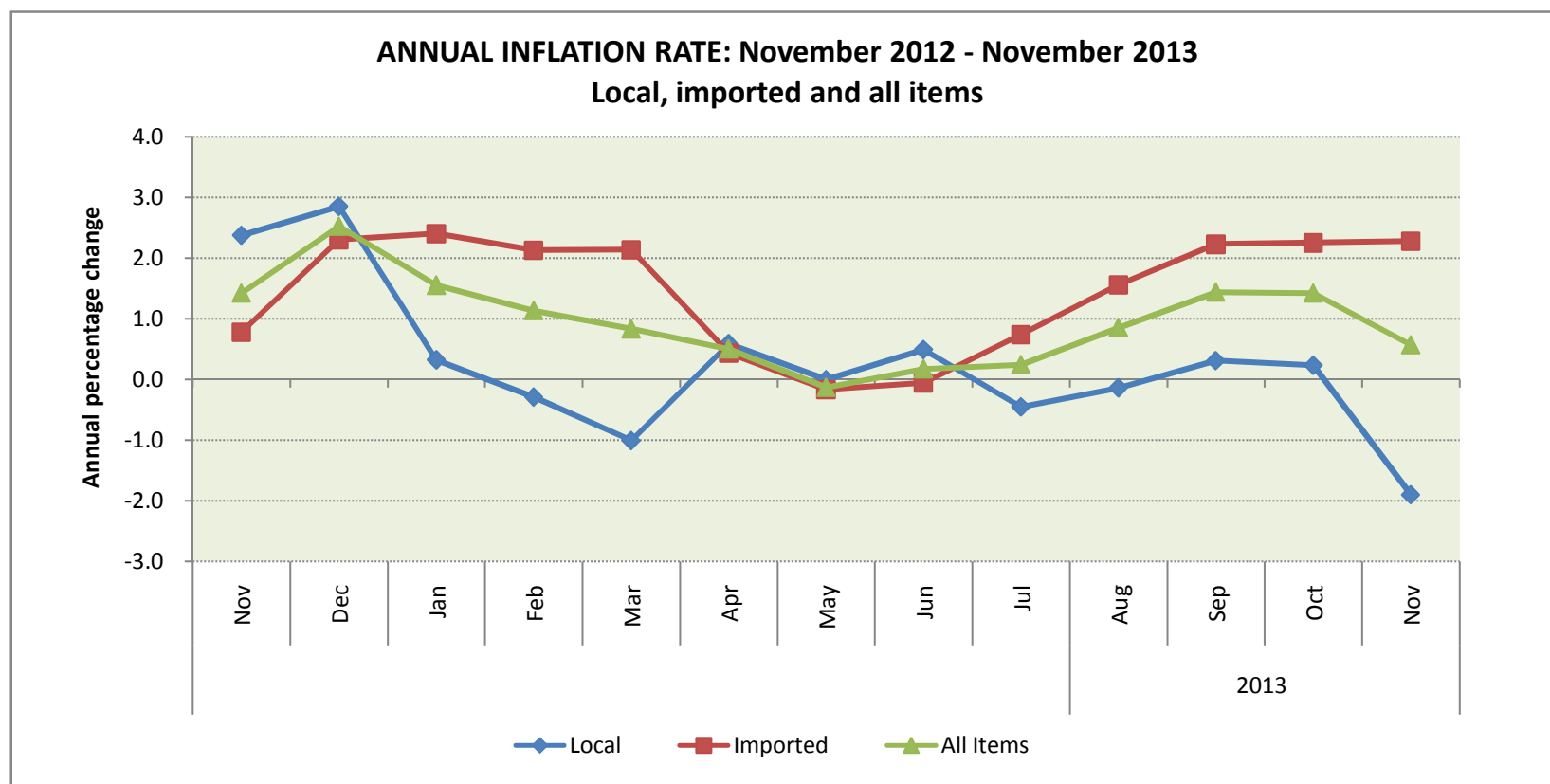
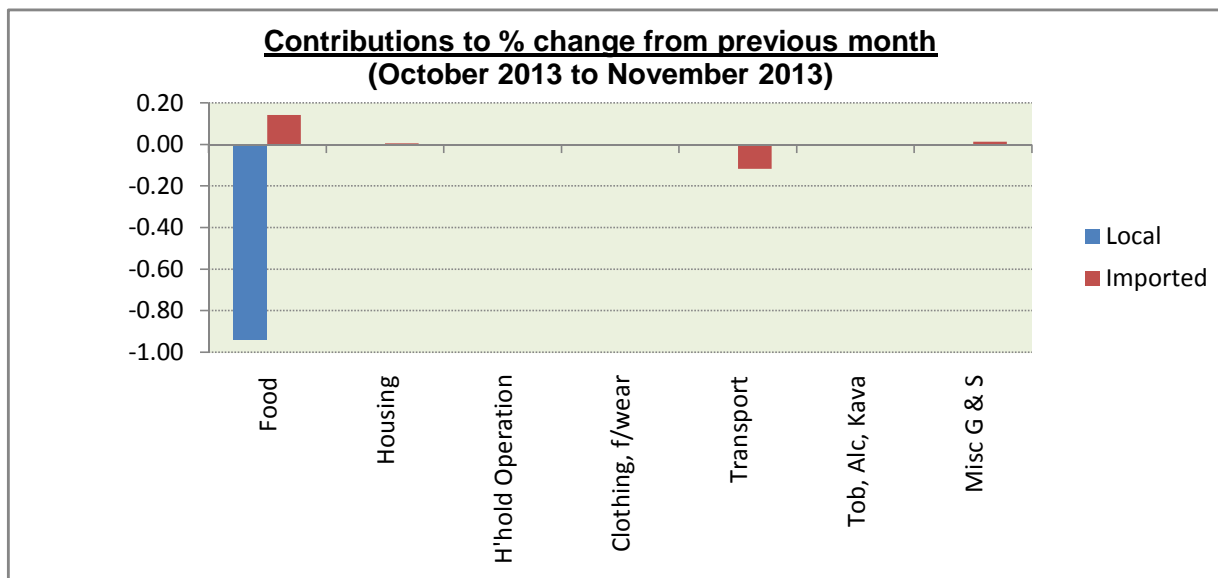


Fig 2: Graphical representation of Annual Inflation rate (%) for Local, Imported and All Items as measured by Consumer Price Index (CPI)

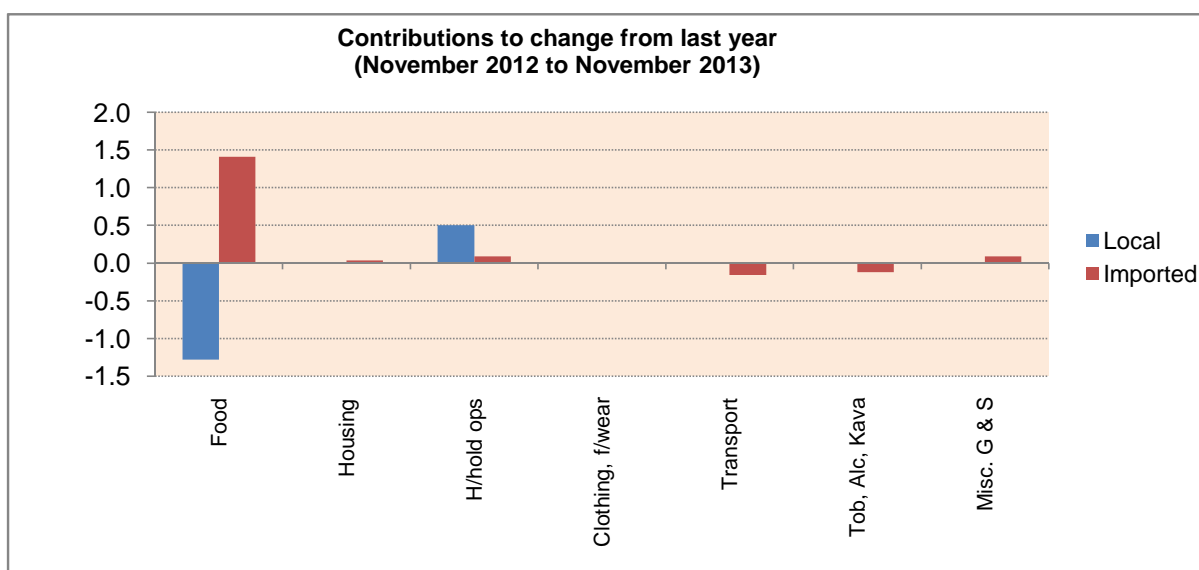

About the Consumer Price Index

The Monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) published by the Statistics Department is accepted as the official measure of inflation in Tonga. The CPI measures the changing price of a fixed basket of goods and services purchased by Tongan households. The selection and relative importance of the goods and services in the CPI basket represents the overall expenditure pattern of Tongan households.

The CPI is used by ministries and other agencies for monitoring economic performance and by the National Reserve Bank of Tonga to help set monetary policy.

The new index reference period of October 2010 (=100.0) was first published for the month of October 2010. Data from the Household Income and Expenditure Survey (HIES) 2009 was used to determine the expenditure pattern of consumers. The proportion of expenditure on each item or group is referred to the weight. The previous reference period was November 2002 based on the results of HIES 2001.

There are 222 items in the Tonga basket classified to seven major groups. The items are further classified by whether they are imported or have been produced locally. The pricing outlets selected in Tongatapu include the Talamahu market (agriculture produce), the Vuna Wharf (fresh fish), super-markets, village stores, petrol stations, restaurants, airlines etc. The CPI covers price changes in Tongatapu Division only due to communication problems with outer island divisions.

The groups and their index reference period weights are shown in the table below.

Further definitions

A **price index** measures the change in price between time periods for a given set of goods and services. It summarises a set of prices for a variety of goods and services collected from a number of outlets.

The **index reference period** is the benchmark to which prices in other periods are compared (e.g. if the index number in a later period is 115, prices have increased by 15.0 percent since the index reference period). Prices for later periods can also be compared in similar fashion.
