PREFACE

annual Gross Domestic Product (GDP) estimates were available to users each year. Thus, the annual GDP for the past 15 years (1993-94 – 2007-08) are shown in this bulletin. These GDP estimates are revised annually when new information becomes available to the Department or when production figures are firmed up for some industries. This Bulletin is the 5^{th} in the series to be published by the Statistics Department, followed the 4^{th} published in June 2005. The department does regret for not able to publish this bulletin annually but





Chart 1: GDP Growth Rates in Current and Constant 2000-01 Prices


Chart 2: GDP (P) Aggregates in Constant 2000-01 Prices





Chart 4: Key Aggregates in Current Prices





Chart 6: GDP by Main Economic Activity in Constant 2000-01 Prices



Chart 7: Agriculture Sector GVA in Constant 2000-01 Prices



Chart 8: Industry Sector GVA in Constant 2000-01 Prices






Chart 10: Expenditure Aggregates in Constant 2000-01 Prices




Chart 11: Final Consumption Expenditure Aggregates in Constant 2000-01 Prices




Chart 12: Gross Fixed Capital Formation in Constant 2000-01 Prices





Chart 13: External Trade in Goods and Services in Constant 2000-01 Prices
